Cancel, OK and Apply buttons behave incorrectly and inconsistently in "Settings>Project Properties"

Description	
<p>e.g. change the CRS or the on-the-fly transformation setting, click apply, then click cancel. When you click cancel it should revert to the previous setting, but it doesn't. (If this was actually the intended behaviour then the OK button should really be labelled "Apply and close")</p> <p>e.g. change the Selection colour, click apply, then click cancel. In this case too, when you click cancel it should revert to the previous setting, but it doesn't.</p> <p>e.g. change the Background colour and click apply. The change is not applied. Click OK. The change is still not applied. Open the project settings again, change the colour again and OK. The colour you changed it to the <i>first</i> time is applied. Open the project settings again, change the colour again and click apply. The colour you changed it to the <i>second</i> time is applied. Click cancel. The colour stays the same. So in this case 1) the cancel button does nothing, and 2) both OK and cancel use the previous change to the setting, not the current change.</p> <p>e.g. change the Project title and click apply. Nothing happens. Click Cancel. The title is changed. So in this case 1) the cancel button does not revert the change, and 2) the Apply button makes the change, but does not apply it.</p> <p>Also see similar bug #3761 for the symbol properties dialog</p> <p>N.B. Hello, bug triage...

When you click cancel it should revert to the previous setting, but it doesn't. (If this was actually the intended behaviour then the OK button should really be labelled "Apply and close")

I do not agree with the "Apply" behavior you are describing. In my opinion, apply is made to apply the configuration to see the changes you've made without closing the configuration window because you need to change something more or you are not sure about your choice. Once applied, the configuration can't be canceled because it has already been applied and this is the new reference configuration project. Cancel button is just there to cancel modifications that have NOT been already applied.

This behavior can be met in nearly every QGIS dialog box that involves Ok/Cancel/Apply (try the style tab for example).

To my mind, we need to keep this behavior as it is. But here are some things to go further on this bug:

- Project CRS is applied immediately (Good).
- Selection color is applied immediately (Good).
- Background color is applied immediately (so it's good now).
- Project title is only displayed after closing the configuration window (which is bad: should have been modified when Apply button is clicked).

To fix this bug, it seems now that we just need to fix the immediate application of the project title (which is the main QGIS window).

What do you think about this ?

Cancel

Resets all settings in the window to those that were in force when the window was opened. Note: this must undo the effects of all applications of the Apply since the window was opened, not just the most recent one.

It used to be a standard which was widely followed, at least on Windows - that's why I expected it to work like that when I filed the ticket.

There seems to be a campaign by both Gnome and Microsoft to do away with both apply buttons and cancel buttons, so they are more difficult to find now, especially both together. They prefer to make dialogs with only one button ("close" or "OK"), and make everything apply instantly, so once you start changing things in a dialog there is no way of cancelling them, even in the case without an "apply button". I've seen some very angry blog posts about how stupid this sort of design is :)

In a quick search the first current example I found that uses Cancel buttons correctly is the Gimp (e.g. in the preferences dialog), although it doesn't have an apply button as it is "instant apply". Interestingly it also has a "reset" button which does the same thing as "cancel", but leaves the dialog open. I rather like this behaviour :) Interestingly the dialogs I checked in Libreoffice also have the "reset" button even though they aren't "instant apply" and don't have an apply button.

I've seen places in Windows 10 where there are both "apply" and "cancel" buttons and they don't follow the standard. Instead the cancel button starts out disabled, then when you change something it is enabled, and when you click it it is disabled again. This is the only behaviour that would make sense if Cancel doesn't undo "applied" changes, but it is less useful, and means that in dialogs with Apply buttons Cancel would behave differently to any dialogs that were "instant apply", if these had a Cancel button to undo the "instant applied" changes and close the dialog...

The bug with applying the background colour has been fixed, so it seems that the behaviour is generally consistent now (even though I don't agree with it ;), although I haven't thoroughly tested everything.

However, this is still true:

change the Project title and click apply. Nothing happens. Click Cancel. The title is changed. So in this case 1) the cancel button does not revert the change, and 2) the Apply button makes the change, but does not apply it.

I assume there is no technical reason why the apply button can't instantly apply this change...
