<p>The ability to use radio buttons or an "option row" (like in IntraMaps.Roam) for relatively short lists in forms could save the user a click (plus scrolling) and is probably the most efficient means of entering such data. Would be nice to have it in QGIS (without the need to use QtDesigner).</p>
