<p>On osgeo4w installation compiling ui files with pyuic4 produces wrong imports for qgis custom widgets. Also all the plugins are affected that try to use ui-files directly with <code>uic.loadUiType()</code>. Plugins crash in this situation.</p> <p>This is because of PyQt is not aware of <code>qgis_customwidgets.py</code> located in <code>qgis\python\PyQt4\uic\widget-plugins</code> folder. In the <code>qgis_customwidgets.py</code> it is commented that the file should be copied into <code>/pythonX/dist-packages/PyQt4/uic/widget-plugins/</code> but it is not.</p> <p>This is discussed in <a href="https://lists.osgeo.org/pipermail/qgis-developer/2015-September/039196.html">https://lists.osgeo.org/pipermail/qgis-developer/2015-September/039196.html</a></p>
