1. Make a layer active in the layers panel
2. Click the *Layer Labelling Options* icon on the toolbar (or *Layer > Labelling* from the menu bar)
3. Make changes to the label settings
4. Click **Apply**, labels don't get updated on the map canvas
5. Click **OK**, dialogue box closes and labels are updated

This is on Ubuntu 15.04 64 bit running QGIS master.
