Description

When using spatialite database I've found strange behaviour: sometime, with no rule, fields are saved incorrectly. This is old problem, same on 2.8, maybe earlier.

This only happens when I use table with (autoincremented) primary key. In 2.8 there was workaround - use table without primary key, but it is impossible in 2.12 (related to #13482).

In example you can find fields "move left" on first two elements. Left or right move, with no rule.

As I said, there is no rule. I cannot specify exact steps, but this only happens when I digitise a lot: most vertex edit, some reshape, split, add ring. Problem show up only when I hit save button.

I am restricted to share all my database, but I attached main tables export ("GeometriaDzialki" and "Zdjecia", as I noticed on polygon and line layers).

Yes, it seems the same issue. From the other ticket "When attributes are getting mixed with other objects, it is often the record above or below in the (table)" that is what happens exactly in the screencast you posted here.

I tried again and again with the table "GeometriaDzialki" and I wasn't able to replicate.

Please test again on QGIS master and report back.

I changed simple data layer into editable spatialite view - same effect of moving fields.

This problem can be replicated consistently with the following steps:

- 1. Create a non-geometry table in a spatialite database. Note: Any table in the Layers Panel can be added easily to a spatialite db using the Offline Editing plugin
- 2. Begin adding records to the table and populate more fields in the second and subsequent records than in the first added record. Note: It does not matter if the table already contains records
- 3. Save your edits and the following behaviour should be observed:
- only those fields that are changed in the first added record will retain data in subsequent records.
- a value entered in any field not edited in the first record will be moved to the first available field in subsequent records.
- if more fields are edited in subsequent records than are edited in the first added record, data entered in the additional fields will be lost on save.

Note, and perhaps this is a key to solving the bug: This behaviour is only reproduced when editing a non-geometry table in a **spatialite** database, not in a regular **sqlite** database.
