Description

Mac OSX El Capitan Version 10.11.5 here with QGis 2.12.1 Lyon.

This happens randomly, not sure what causes it, but at some point when trying to open the file selector menu for the following purposes (I'm certain there are more)...

- georeferencer selecting image
- opening vector file from within program
- selecting file for debugger output (sorry, no debugger output available now...)
- ...the file selection window pops up for an instant but closes immediately. Only remedy is to quit and restart the program.

Does not happen when right clicking on a layer and trying to save it, so that may help with isolating the problem.

It also includes hundreds of new functions, usability improvements, bugfixes, and other goodies. See the relevant changelogs for a good sampling of all the new features that have gone into version 3.4

Most plugins have been either migrated or incorporated into the core QGIS code base.

We strongly discourage the continued use of QGIS 2.18 LTR as it is now officially unsupported, which means we'll not provide any bug fix releases for it.

You should also note that we intend to close all bug tickets referring to the now obsolete LTR version. Original reporters will receive a notification of the
