#### Description

In a shapefile layer, I apply a Query Builder expression. Later, I clear the Query Builder, so I can make an edit. However, the 'Toggle Editing' button is still greyed out, and the Layer Source has the full path but with ".shp|layerid=0" at the end of it. I can work around this by saving, closing, and re-opening my .qgs file. Then, the layer is back to normal and I can edit it.

The following may be consistent and repeatable.

Apply a query builder expression to a shapefile layer.

Save and close the file.

Re-open the file. (The layer cannot be edited)

Clear the query. (The layer still cannot be edited)
