That's already available. In the CRS tab of Settings/Options you can select if you want to be prompted for a CRS, use the project's CRS or a preselected CRS. That setting is also used when creating new shape files.

Loading an existing layer and creating a new one are 2 separate things.

I believe that a CRS of a newly created layer should be handled by a separate setting in Settings>Options, defaulting to inheriting the CRS of the current project.

The existing Settings>Options>CRS implicitly states it is for "When layer is loaded that has no CRS".
