#### Description

The browser panel doesn't show all the drives I can connect to. Actually it fails to show a drive I pluged in as a network drive. As you can see in the screenshot, the "SIG" folder (which is a folder on the macOS company network) doesn't appear in the browser panel.

However, I can have access to that folder if I use the classic Add vector/raster layer tool.

I think that if we want the browser panel become the first place to add layers from (with the Data Source Manager restructuring in QGIS 3), it must be possible to show all the network and remote drivers in the tree (and not only what is accessible locally).

For what I can see, it's the only dialog in QGIS where only local drivers are accessible.
