<p>Using the attribute table's "advanced search" button (or a rule-based rendering filter):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Type a search query using an attribute column which doesn't exist (e.g. maybe you search for DIAM=150 because you misremembered the name of a column called DIA)</li><li>- Click the "test" button</li><li>- A message box will say "found 0 matching feature(s)"</li></ul> <p>It would be better to say "Column 'OBJECTI' does not exist".</p>
