<p>With a vector layer in WGS84 (mifmid or shape)cannot "move" it to Lambert4carto so all my projects do not work no more. It stays at the same place.</p> <p>I can't even "save as" shape (or mifmid)from wgs84 to lambert 4 carto. Got this msg:</p> <p>Export to vector file failed.</p> <p>Error: Failed to transform a point while drawing a feature of type 'ifnGuagno'. Writing stopped. (Exception: forward transform of (0.154603, 0.7364)</p> <p>failed with error: failed to load datum shift file</p> <p>)</p> <p>Even with a project that was working with 1.5 and all previous versions since 0.7.4</p>
